2nd Annual 3d Printers Showcase – Part II

More than 210 Greater Cincinnati students and over 90 teachers, volunteer coaches, and family members attended the region's 2nd annual 3d Printers Showcase - Part II @ Cincinnati State Technical and Community College's Center of Innovative Technologies on May 1, 2018. Guest exhibitors and presenters participated from GE, P&G, Polar3D, GorillaMaker, and Tech Soft 3D. Highlights included engineering lab tours and a wide variety of student-designed and 3D-printed cars. Showcase Part I was hosted at the University of Cincinnati for 340+ club members on April 26, 2018.

What is the 3d Printers Club?

- A [Greater Cincinnati STEM Collaborative \(GCSC\)](#) club that ran at more than [39 schools and partner organizations around the Greater Cincinnati region](#). Over the course of the 10-week clubs, students design solutions to real problems and print them in the classroom. Clubs are led by school-based teachers & other leaders and supported by volunteer STEM professional coaches who expose students to STEM career opportunities.
- The club includes two curricula, Problem Solving Inventions and 3D Grand Prix, and was started in 2014 with seed funding provided by P&G.



What is GCSC and How to Get Involved?

Launched by P&G and StrivePartnership in 2011, GCSC brings education, community and business partners together to provide hands-on, engaging learning experiences for Greater Cincinnati's students. GCSC amplifies STEM activity across the Greater Cincinnati STEM ecosystem to grow student interest in, and skills and confidence to pursue, STEM careers. GCSC improves STEM access for all students and prioritizes partners serving higher percentages of students under-represented in STEM for direct funding and support.
