


You don't have to change "you" to change the world!

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The Myths	Busting the Myths
Girls are under-represented in STEM because they are not as good at the subjects.	Girls and boys perform equally well in mathematics and science on standardized tests
Girls don't want to study STEM subjects.	Girls participate in high level mathematics and science courses at similar rates as boys, with the exception of computer science and engineering.
Women don't want to work in STEM.	There are more women in STEM jobs in other parts of the world than there are in the US.
People are better at either sciences or arts but not both.	Many companies look for creative, artistic STEM people for design work and good communicators for training or technical writing.
